WHAT IS MENTORING

"An informal or formal process of support by an experienced and trusted adviser" - Oxford Dictionary

Mentoring is a powerful personal development and empowerment tool.It is described as a personal enhancement strategy through which one experienced person or individual facilitates the development of another by sharing his/her expertise, skills and perspective with an aim to help the learner to progress in his/her career development.

PURPOSE OF MENTORING

Mentoring is a voluntary but helpful relationship between mentor and mentee based upon mutual trust and respect. It provides the mentee with an opportunity to think about their career progression, help them to explore new ideas, believe in them and to boost their confidence. Conversely, it provides the mentor to further enhance his/her skills and knowledge in those areas by continuously reassessing.

WHO ARE PCMS?

The Professional Careers Mentoring Scheme (PCMS) is a project of the Muslim Professionals Forum (MPF). MPF was established in 2008 and is an independent and non profit organisation.

MPF recognised the need for a mentoring project in Tower Hamlets in order to tackle the high level of unemployment in under-25s and bring together professionals with students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

The scheme is open to Year 12 students of all abilities and hopes to help students to consider the possible career routes available to them after completion of their studies.

- To provide students with the opportunity to consider some of the careers paths available to students after study
- To give students the opportunity to network with professionals who have done well in their chosen careers.
- To help students gain an understanding of the different routes that can be taken before getting a job.
